Three Methods To Make Trees For Your Layout

- Purchased kit from Woodland Scenics.
- Sedum garden plant to make small, filler trees.
- Azalea prunings to make "dead" trees.

- Bought a kit to make 3" upswept trees off eBay.
 - Soft metal molded trunk and limbs.
 - Clean off flash.
 - $\circ~$ Wash in soap and water.
 - Prime, paint with flat gray primer.
 - Finish mist with flat or satin black, tan, white paint.
 - Finely ground foam in mesh.
 - Cut and apply as foliage.
 - $\circ~$ Plant on layout.

How to Create Simple Trees From Sedum

- Dried flower heads and stems create simple trees.
- Harvest in December or January.
- Shake or brush flowers and leaves off, leaving structure.
- Spray with weak solution of bleach (optional).
- Spray with flat gray primer.

How to Create Simple Trees From Sedum

- Mist with flat or satin black, tan, light green (moss), white.
- $\circ~$ Use acrylic craft paints for accent colors on the tree "trunks."
 - $\circ~$ Tan, white, gray.
- $\circ~$ Lightly spray adhesive on the tips.
- Dip in ground foam of varying colors and sizes.
- Plant in a hole in the layout.






























Azaleas as Dead Trees

- Evergreen and deciduous varieties available locally.
- Opportunities as you prune or remove dead sections.

Preparing the Azalea Trees

- Must be completely dry, not green.
- Remove loose bark with a wire brush. Cut off twiggy growth.
- Spray with a weak bleach solution then follow with soap and water for possible insects.
- $\circ~$ Allow to dry.
- $\circ~$ Prime with flat gray primer.

Preparing the Azaleas (cont.)

- Paint with craft paints: Tan, brown, black, white, gray.
- White edging around "holes" in the dead tree.
- Drill and insert small nail if from a larger plant. Otherwise,
 drill a small hole in the layout base material.
- $\circ~$ Plant on layout.

















Combined Effects On The Layout

- $\circ~$ Living trees.
- $\circ~$ Leaning trees.
- Dead logs.
- Fallen limbs.
- $\circ~$ Low growth.
- Woodland Scenics kit trees, sedum trees, azalea dead trees.

- Scenery sets the stage for our model railroading world in miniature.
- Trees can be purchased complete, made from a purchased kit, or made with a combination of natural and purchased materials.
